- 1. Uso incorrecto del presente simple vs presente continuo
- X "I am go to school every day."
- ✓ "I go to school every day."

(El presente continuo se usa para acciones en progreso, no hábitos.)

- 2. Olvidar el pasado simple de los verbos irregulares
- X "Yesterday I go to the supermarket."
- "Yesterday I went to the supermarket."

(A menudo siguen usando la forma base en lugar del pasado irregular.)

- 3. Uso incorrecto de "do/does" en preguntas
- X "Where you live?"
- ✓ "Where do you live?"

(Olvidan el auxiliar "do/does" en preguntas del presente simple.)

- 4. Confundir "will" y "going to"
- X "I going to call you tomorrow."
- ✓ "I will call you tomorrow." o "I am going to call you tomorrow."

(Eligen mal según el contexto: promesas/spontaneous \rightarrow "will", planes \rightarrow "going to".)

- 5. Uso incorrecto de "there is / there are"
- X "There are a cat on the roof."
- ✓ "There is a cat on the roof."

(Confusión entre singular/plural.)

6. Mal uso del present perfect

- X "I have seen her yesterday."
- ✓ "I saw her yesterday."

(Con el present perfect se ve este fallo de usar marcadores de pasado definidos, como "yesterday", cuando se debe usar el pasado simple.)

- 7. Confundir "for" y "since"
- X "I've lived here since 5 years."
- "I've lived here for 5 years."

("For" se usa con duración; "since" con un punto en el tiempo.)

- 8. Omitir el sujeto en las oraciones
- X "Is raining today."
- ✓ "It is raining today."

(En inglés siempre se necesita un sujeto explícito, excepto en imperativo.)

- 9. Traducción literal del español
- X "I have 20 years."
- ✓ "I am 20 years old."

(Influencia directa del español al traducir estructuras.)

- **10. Uso repetido de estructuras básicas sin avanzar.** Muchos alumnos se quedan usando:
 - solo el presente simple,
 - pocas expresiones de tiempo,
 - oraciones muy cortas y simples sin usar conectores (because, so, also...).
